Maps-MD helps identify mental health benefits for people living in Maryland covered by the Medicaid and uninsured programs in the state.

You must call the number above to ask for mental health services.

If you do not have Medicaid, you will be asked questions to see if you are eligible for "grey zone" coverage. If you answer, "Yes," to any of these questions, you may be eligible for mental health services.

- Have you been in the public mental health system in the last 2 years?
- Do you receive Maryland Pharmacy Assistance?
- Are you homeless in the state of Maryland?
- Have you recently been released from prison or jail?
- Have you been recently discharged from a Maryland-based psychiatric hospital or residential crisis service?
- Have you received orders of a conditional release from a hospital?
